Rangers will also provide high quality animal care through enrichment, training, and diet preparation. These are full-time, seasonal positions lasting from the end of April until November 1, 2025 with the possible opportunity to become a full-time team member.

Candidates must be able to follow instructions, handle money, be comfortable with public speaking to various size groups, and maintain a calm and friendly demeanor. Previous industry experience is strongly preferred. Applicants must be able to work in a variety of conditions and lift 50 pounds. Qualified candidates will also have an outgoing personality, excellent communication skills, and attention to detail.
